## RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE U.S. CONGRESS FOR PRESERVING MILITARY LIBRARIES

Whereas, the United States Congress has proposed language in the 1999 Defense Authorization bill

prohibiting the closing of libraries on military installations, except in cases where the

bases are closing;

Whereas, military libraries rank consistently in the top five of morale, welfare and recreation

programs in terms of usage and extreme importance by service members, family

members, retirees, and civilians as an essential part of their community; and

Whereas, the United States Congress recognizing the value of this service to members of the

military recommended legislative language prohibiting closure of any more libraries and

authorizing that closed libraries be reopened; and

Whereas, commanders acting under constrained resources are advised by the United States

Congress through the Department of Defense that they must consider the value of military

libraries and exercise caution and prudence in further closures; and

Whereas, such congressional action serves as an encouragement for upgrading military libraries

through enhanced automation; improved military research resources; education and

recreational materials, and overall improved quality of life; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that the American Library Association commend the United States Congress, particularly

the efforts of the House Committee on National Security Special Oversight Panel on Morale, Welfare and Recreation, chaired by Representative John McHugh (R-NY), for their wisdom in stopping military library closings as recommended in the 1999 Defense

Authorization bill; and be it further

Resolved, that the American Library Association express its appreciation to the United States

Congress for hearing the voices of service members and in turn acting to meet their needs;

and be it further

Resolved, that the American Library Association urge the United States Congress and the

Department of Defense to continue to support military libraries by upgrading military

library services through automation and increased funding, so that the quality of life, and

readiness of airmen, seamen, marines and soldiers are fulfilled.
