ALA APPOINTS ERA TASK FORCE

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

The American Library Association's ERA Task Force held its first meeting Aug. 10-11, 1979 at the Graduate School of Library and Information Science, University of Pittsburgh, PA.

There, the Task Force outlined a plan of action to be presented to the ALA Executive Board during its meeting in October. As a preliminary step, the Task Force is gathering pertinent data on ERA from each ALA Chapter.

The Task Force was formed by the ALA Council during the 1979 Midwinter Meeting and was charged with the following: "The purposes of the ALA ERA Task Force are assistance and consultation with ALA Chapters in carrying out the commitment to passage of the Equal Rights Amendment in ways best suited to the individual states."

The nine-member committee was appointed in June 1979 by ALA President Thomas Galvin. Each member brings an important combination of commitment and experience to the Task Force.

Kay Cassell, Committee Co-Chairperson, is the Director of Bethlehem Public Library, Delmar, NY. Cassell's ALA activities include serving as editor of <u>Women in Libraries</u>, a newsletter of the ALA Social Responsibilities Round Table (SRRT) Task Force on Women and on the Steering Committee for the Library Administration and Management Association Discussion Group. She is also a member of the Albany Business and Professional Women's Club.

Alice Ihrig, Committee Co-Chairperson, is the Director of Civic and Cultural

Ihrig has served on the ALA Council, Executive Board, and is on the Ad Hoc Committee on the White House Conference on Library and Information Services. Anita Anker is a research assistant and Doctoral student at the School of Library and Information Science, Drexel University, Philadelphia, PA. She has served as NOW National Task Force Coordinator on Feminism in Rural America; NOW North Dakota State Coordinator, North Dakota ERA Ratification Coalition Executive Board, and Founder and President of North Dakota's Women's Coalition.

Barbara Bryan is a librarian at the Nyselius Library, Fairfield University, Fairfield, CT. She is a member of several ALA divisions: Association of College and Research Libraries, Library Information and Technology Association, Resources and Technical Services Division, and Reference and Adult Services Division. She is currently an ALA Connecticut Chapter Councilor, and serves on the Chapter Relations Committee, the ALA Council Orientation Committee, and is a member of the Women Administrators Discussion Group.
