I. Clarify Charge -- Focus of Document

Document will be written in a manner that will provide the children's services practitioner with an effective tool to influence decision-makers and persons responsible for allocation of resources, such as library directors, budget directors, City Councils, library boards, etc.

Document will be dispassionate and attempt to address the significance of and quantify the importance of library service to children. It will focus on the service itself, not the structure of service or who should provide the service.

Accompanying explanatory materials will provide guidance in effective usage of the document and indicate the need to review the document regularly and customize it as necessary for local use.
