The Association of State Library Agencies is calling for papers to be presented at ALA's 1978 annual conference in Chicago, June 25 - July 1, 1978.

Papers should address the theme: "Multitype library networking: Is it an answer to current fiscal problems?" They should be of professional interest, drawn from personal experience or research. Papers should not have been previously published or presented before a national group. Oral presentation should take no longer than 30 minutes.

Abstracts of 150 words must be submitted no later than January 15, 1978 and must:

- establish the paper's content
- indicate research methodology, if applicable
- highlight results
- indicate conclusions.
