RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Germaine Krettek has indicated her intention to retire from the Directorship of the American Library Association Washington Office this year; and

WHEREAS, Miss Krettek's more than 15 years of inspired, dedicated, and productive service as Director of the Washington Office have yielded inestimable and continuing benefit to American libraries and their users; and

WHEREAS, her professional and leadership talents exercised as Associate Executive Director of this Association have advanced the programs of the Association and its work on the national and international levels; and

WHEREAS, her expertise and outstanding skills of communication and persuasion have earned her the confidence of Members of Congress and the officials of four Presidential Administrations; and

WHEREAS, her accomplishments have won her and the American Library Association the admiration and respect of Washington observers, the press, and her fellow legislative advocates;
