## New Executive Board Members Elected

Thomas J. Galvin, Dean of the University of Pittsburgh's Graduate School of Library and Information Sciences and Kathleen Molz, doctoral candidate at Columbia University's School of Library Service, were elected to the ALA's Executive Board during the Midwinter Meeting in Chicago last January.

Galvin and Molz were elected by Council from a field of six candidates.

Prior to joining the University of Pittsburgh faculty, Galvin was acting and associate director as well as professor in the School of Library Science at Simmons College in Boston. He is also the former assistant director of libraries at Simmons, chief librarian of the Abbot Public Library in Marblehead, Massachusetts, and reference librarian at Boston University.

Kathleen Molz has worked in the municipal public libraries of Baltimore, Denver and Philadelphia and is the former editor of WILSON LIBRARY BULLETIN. She was also the chief planning officer for the library programs administered by the U.S. Office of Education in Washington, D.C.

Galvin has been active in library associations at the national, regional, and state levels. His service contributions to the American Library Association include the presidency of the Library Education Division (LED), among a long

Molz is former chairperson of the Intellectual Freedom Committee and vice-president of the Freedom to Read Foundation. She is also a former member of Council.
