"Free Speech and Censorship" will be the topic of a speech by social philosopher Ernest van den Haag, at a meeting of the Intellectual Freedom Committee, Thursday, July 11, during the Annual Conference of the American Library Association in New York City, July 7 - 13, 1974.

Mr. van den Haag is presently Adjunct Professor of Social Philosophy at New York University; lecturer in Sociology and Psychology at the New School for Social Research. He is a practicing psychoanalyst; Fellow, American Sociological Association; Royal Economic Society; Guggenheim Fellow 1967; and Senior Fellow, National Endowment for the Humanities 1973. Among his many publications are The Fabric of Society and Passion and Social Constraint. He has been a contributor to many publications, among them are Partisan Review; Annals of the American Academy of Political and Social Science; Encounter; Social Problems; Modern Age; University Bookman; The New Leader; National Review; Harpers; and Esquire.
