ALA Annual 2020 Canceled and Virtual Event Planned

The American Library Association's Executive Board announced that the 2020 ALA Annual Conference & Exhibition scheduled for June 25-30 in Chicago has been canceled.

"ALA's priority is the health and safety of the library community, including our members, staff,



supporters, vendors and volunteers," said Wanda K. Brown, ALA president. "As the COVID-19 pandemic unfolds, it's become clear that in the face of an unprecedented situation, we need to make tough choices."

Diversity Research Applications Extended Through May 15



ALA Diversity Research Grant Program has extended 2020-2021 grant applications through May 15, 2020.

The Diversity Research Grant (DRG) consists of a one-time \$2,500 award for original research. A jury of ALA members evaluates proposals and is encouraged to award a total of three awards. Grant proposals may address any topic that speaks to critical gaps in the knowledge of equity, diversity, and inclusion issues within library and information

science.

The Diversity Research Grant Program is currently accepting proposals for projects running July 1, 2020 to June 30, 2021, proposals should be sent to <u>diversity@ala.org</u> by 11:59 p.m. Pacific time on May 15, 2020. The 2020 Diversity Research Grants will be announced on June 15, 2020.

Call for Proposals: Internet Filtering, Digital Literacy, and Information Poverty: Intersections and Challenges

> Internet filtering is a crucial issue because it restricts access to a broad array of information, needed to combat the rising tide of fake news and misinformation. Experts agree that the best ways to



combat "fake news" are improved digital literacy and better access to better information. Nonetheless, internet filtering—which impacts both literacy and access—remains widespread. Internet filtering has three interrelated research issues: a lack of research and knowledge about internet filtering in the U.S.; disparate effects of filtering, along socioeconomic lines; and negative impacts on digital literacy.

This national symposium at the University of

Kentucky will investigate these interlocking problems of internet filtering, digital literacy, and information poverty. Individuals are encouraged to submit proposals by June 15, 2020.
