## LES Conference Program Planning Committee - Orlando

### 2016 ALA Annual Conference Meeting Minutes

Monday, June 27, 8:30-10:00am EST

#### 1. Welcome and Introductions

In attendance: Zara Wilkinson and Kristina De Voe (chair).

#### 2. Approval of Agenda

The agenda was approved.

#### 3. Review and Discussion of Forum

The joint LES/WESS/SEES forum took place on Saturday, June 25th 1:00-2:30pm with 40-50 attendees present. The forum's title was "Archiving the Present: Primary Sources & New and Distinctive Collections in European and American Studies." This program convened a panel of librarians and other collectors to discuss efforts to collect, catalog, and preserve print and digital ephemera associated with high-impact events (i.e. Charlie Hebdo, Euromaidan, Sandy Hook school shooting), contemplating ways in which research libraries are or should be evolving policies and practices to support contemporary evolutions in research. Kristina De Voe moderated the forum. The presentations were timely, engaging, and complemented one another well. Questions were asked during the FAQ, and attendees actively tweeted about the individual presentations. Print and online surveys were distributed following the forum; however, low response rate precluded in-depth analysis.

The forum was promoted multiple ways including via the sections' listservs, newsletters, and social media accounts (Twitter and Facebook); attempts were also made to target RBMS members to attend via Twitter.

#### 4. Suggestions for Upcoming Year/Committee

Suggestions for next year's committee and LES Executive team included:

- Consider a different time slot. The 1:00-2:30pm is a popular time slot, and the forum competed with individual DHIG and IS programs -- both of which are of interest to our membership.
