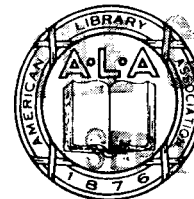

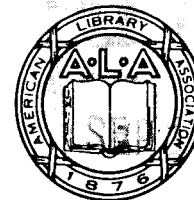

We hope that you will give favorable consideration to our request with regard to granting United States citizens who wish to attend the IFLA Conference in Cuba permission to do so.

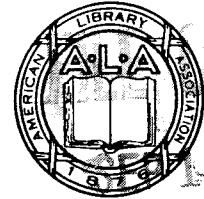
