ACCEPTANCE SPEECH

Melissa: Hello, I'm Melissa Carlson, senior digital producer on *Molly of Denali*.

Bill: And I'm Bill Shribman, executive producer on the very same project.

Melissa: We're here to thank you for the ALSC's Excellence in Early Learning Digital Media Award for our work on *Molly of Denali*.

Bill: *Molly* is a PBS KIDS show, produced by WGBH Boston. It was funded by the US Department of Education under a Ready to Learn grant, supported by the Corporation for Public Broadcasting.

Melissa: It's the first national children's series to feature a Native American lead character—Molly Mabray, a feisty and resourceful 10-year-old Alaska Native girl. She takes viewers ages four to eight along on her adventures, fostering literacy skills along the way.

Bill: It's not just a TV series, and that's where we come in. We've produced a website, a suite of digital games, and a free app, and it's this app that you



have kindly acknowledged in your award.

Melissa: In the app, children can go on dog sledding races, create beading projects, go fishing, and help run the Denali Trading Post.

Bill: The *Molly of Denali* app teaches children to use familiar texts such as books, diagrams, and captioned photos as part of an informational text curriculum. This helps them to solve problems, accomplish tasks, and help Molly's friends on their adventures.

Melissa: Our informational text cur-
