Random Notes:

Karen Whittlesey-First is the new Female Co-chair. Her first priority (I hope she agrees with me) is the 1993 Program. A basic committee was formed in San Antonio, Terry Allison is the chair. Anyone interested should contact him or Karen. There were only two suggestions for a program topic so far, and any ideas are also welcome.

Joe is working on the minutes and the Steering Committee directory. They should be out near the beginning of April.

The Pre-Conference is all set. The keynote speaker is Estelle Freedman, co-author of Intimate Matters; a history of sexuality in America Harper-Row, 1988. Other speakers so far are Sherry Thomas of Spinster Aunt Lute Press. She is also on the board of the San Francisco Public Library Foundation. ALA/OLOS will handle pre-registration and I am working to make sure the money goes into our account.

That brings me to say that I am making my first priority figuring out the budget with Mattye. I will keep you posted.

San Antonio was good. I feel it was fairly productive as far as conference planning is involved. Some points to consider:

We will establish a by-laws revision committee in San Francisco. Among the changes:


- Establish the Lifetime Achievement Award
- Change the function of Secretary/Treasurer to Secretary only
- Incorporate budgetary responsibility into Co-Chairs' job
- Establish a Finance/Fund Raising Committee
- Any other proposed changes

The periodical indexing issue, as far as approaching Wilson goes, has been "toned down", but we aren't through with them yet. Since some companies have begun some indexing, a different approach is being considered. One possibility is to get someone on the RASD indexing committee. Polly Thistlethwaite is following up on how to do this and/or getting herself on the board. Anyone with ideas, suggestions, etc. please contact Polly at Hunter College Library.

We still need a Coordinator for the Clearinghouse and a Liaison to the Feminist Task Force.

Speaking of Clearinghouse, here is what has happened. I have the materials that Ankha had for filling orders. I do not have the computer discs for the originals. Cal, do you have any information about where they might be? I am all caught up on filling the orders from December through February. I sent the originals to ALA and had them make up about 50 copies of everything, collated and stapled at 5 cents per copy. Even though some of them need revisions, this will hold us over for the next few orders. My library could not pick up copying costs, so I had ALA do it. And why not, that's what they're there for. At any rate, we can work on revisions while this large inventory holds out. We still need a Coordinator; I don't plan on doing this for very long. My thinking is however, that ALA/OLOS might be talked into filling orders as well, even though the staff numbers two (Mattye and Gail) for the OLOS office. They still aren't keen on it, but time will tell. In the meantime, there are two other people that may be interested. Anyone else interested, please contact me.
