RASD plans preconference on reference service for genealogists

"Reference Service for Genealogists: A Mini-Course for Librarians" will be held on Friday, June 25, from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., as a preconference to the American Library Association (ALA) Annual Conference in New Orleans. The deadline for registration is May 25.

The six-hour preconference, sponsored by the Reference and Adult Services Division (RASD) History Section Genealogy Committee, will be preented by Janet G. and J. Carlyle Parker.

It will cover such topics as the effective reference interview, genealogical research, basic research methods of genealogical research, research strategies, collection development, referrals, interlibrary loan, research sources for genealogical research for Americans and basic reference books needed in all libraries.
