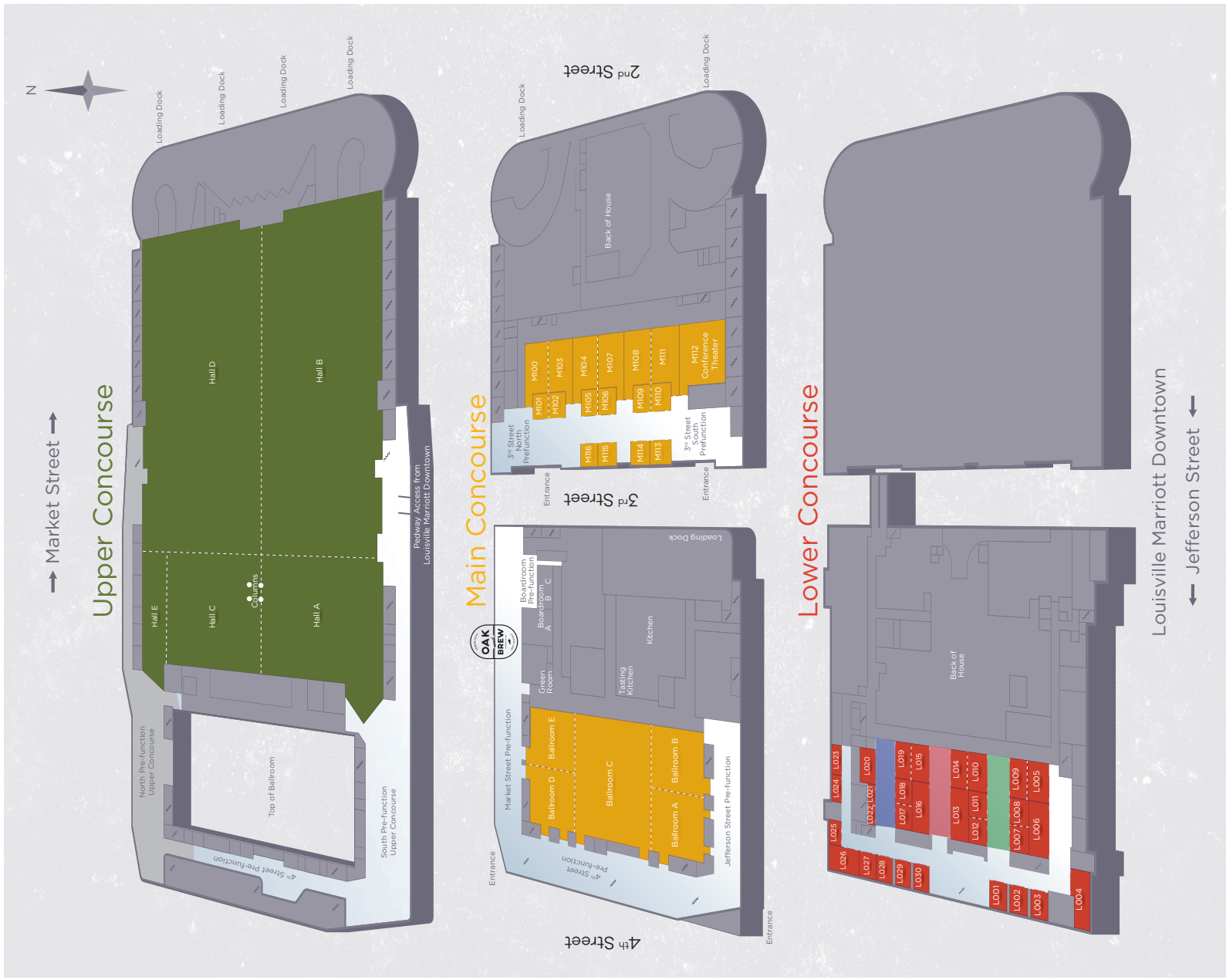
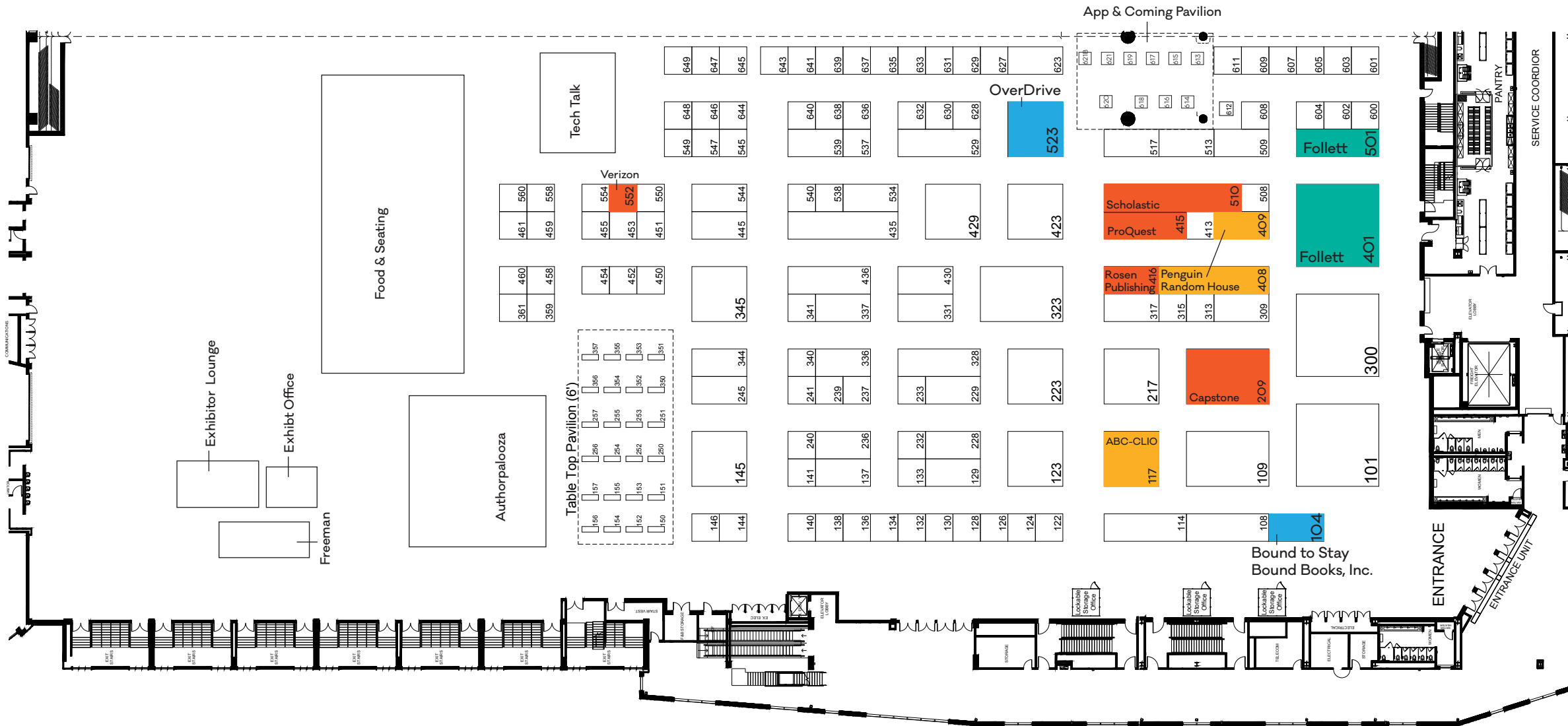


Exhibit Floor Map

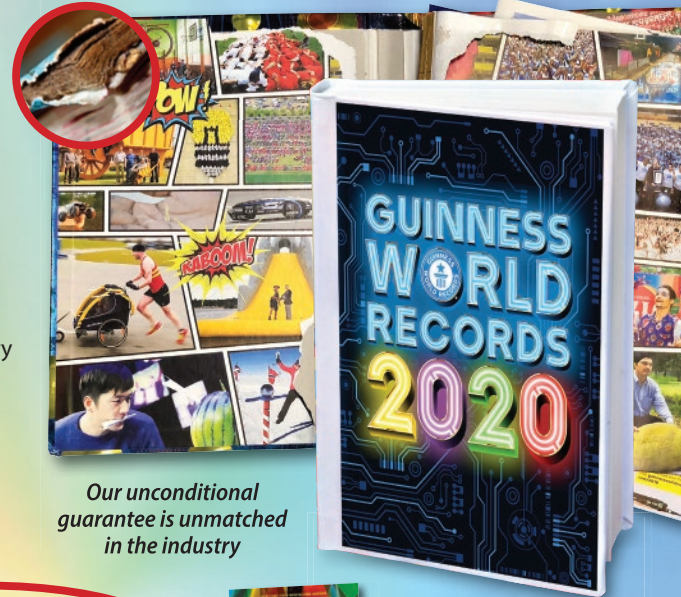
