

I am overwhelmed by the gratitude I feel for this honor and for those who have helped me achieve it. I remember how incredibly excited I felt the day I received the offer from Lee & Low to illustrate Monica Brown's book, *Sharuko: El Arqueólogo Peruano/Peruvian Archaeologist Julio C. Tello*. I was as thrilled that this book was being made, as I was to be given the opportunity



The story of Dr. Tello is that of a man who's love and pride for his culture led him on a mission to discover more about his ancestors and to share his discoveries in a way that brought pride to all Peruvians but especially indigenous Peruvians like himself. Because of his incredible contributions I felt a strong desire as a Peruvian to portray our country and one of our national heroes in an exciting and beautiful way, as well as the responsibility as a non-indigenous Peruvian to portray as accurately and authentically as possible the story of this indigenous boy who became one of the most celebrated archaeologists of the Americas and the first person to study Peru's past through the lens of a Quechuaspeaking indigenous man.

I was born in Lima, Peru, but came to the United States with my family at a young age. Thanks to my mother, Peru was kept very much alive in our home. Both of my parents spoke Spanish to us, and my mother cooked Peruvian food, played Peruvian music, and decorated the house with the stunning arts

from the markets, and replicas of Paracas tapestries, and Pre-Columbian ceramics. On trips back to Peru, museums and archeological sites were at the top of the list of places to visit. These trips were the highlights of my childhood, and I've always been drawn back. Though I may have, at times, felt a little shy about being different from my US friends, I felt deeply proud to be Peruvian, of my culture, and this magical, mysterious place where I came from. I realize now this was a gift my mother gave me by sharing her own cultural love, pride, and many varied interests with us. Her excitement was contagious, and that kind of contagious excitement over our cultures, roots, and sense of belonging, is one of the most wonderful things organizations like the Association for Library Service to Children, REFORMA, and Pura Belpré help foster.

My heartfelt thanks go out to the Association for Library Service to Children, REFORMA, the Pura Belpré founders, and the 2021 Pura Belpré Committee, for this wonderful honor, which I share with the incredible Monica Brown. I am extremely honored to see my name alongside that of this year's winners, especially illustration award winner Raúl The Third and those of the many past winners who inspire me so much. Thank you for supporting our work. I want to give a very special thank you to Monica Brown for writing this book and many others that instill such pride and joy in so many, my daughter included! Monica is one of the most gracious people I've ever had the pleasure of collaborating with, and collaborate we did!
