- STARS outreach and promotion, had committee census (what want, reasons to join, be more engage) held off due to RUSA census, how to get more engaged; less on what doing
- Content and meetings with vendors
- Opportunities for engagement outside of meetings
- Leveraging the new tracks to be mindful of common issues with EDI and places for conversations
- Big and cumbersome and limited resources for big conferences
- How to duplicate what we're doing in person, online, how to provide impact beyond F2F
- Midwinter as regional hubs? Leverage that type of model | local-national hybrid (concurrent with midwinter)
- Proactive about where we are going to be; reach out to local and regional organizations (i-schools too)
- Phased conversations tying virtual conversations / programing to F2F at conference
- Topics that people are interested in currently and not in a two
