MIDWINTER MEETING

The Junior College Libraries Section of ACRL held its meeting at the Midwinter Conference of the American Library Association on Tuesday, February 1, 1955 at 2:30 P.M. in the East Lounge of the Edgewater Beach Hotel.

Dr. John H. Russel, Dean, Shimer College, Mt. Carroll, Illinois spoke on "The Library Self Survey." The business meeting of the session was devoted to discussion of the report of the Standards Committee of which Ruth Bradley, Librarian, Santa Ana College, Santa Ana, California is chairman. The discussion centered principally on the standards for personnel. It was thought that the situation of the non-resident, technical

and vocational junior colleges present a different problem from that of the resident colleges which stress the liberal arts. A subcommittee, headed by Catherine Cardew was appointed to clarify that section of the report and to make recommendations to the Committee on Standards.

WORKSHOP FOR JUNIOR COLLEGE LIBRARIANS Summer, 1956

A number of junior college librarians have mentioned the need for workshops in that field. Here is the answer to your pleas.

The Department of Library Science, Kansas State Teachers College, Pittsburg, Kansas, has tentative plans to offer a Junior College Library Workshop in the summer of 1956. Dr. John F. Harvey, head librarian, is interested in obtaining both suggestions of subjects junior college librarians are interested in, and an estimate of the number of junior college librarians who would attend. The Workshop would last two weeks, and would carry 2 hours of graduate credit. Write to Dr. Harvey about your interest in such a course. He is eager to hear from junior college librarians.

STATISTICS

Were you not gratified to see the Junior College Library Statistics printed in College and Research Libraries? Thelma Taylor, Chairman of the Committee on Statistics deserves a big hand for her very fine work on the questionnaire and in organizing the results so that they are considered of value for printing in C&RL. In 1955-56, the ACRL Statistics form will be sent to junior college libraries. Ruth Scarborough who is the junior college member of the ACRL Statistics Committee will have charge of the compilation. Questionnaires will be sent out in August by the chairman of the ACRL Statistics Committee. Remember to return them to Ruth Scarborough, Centenary Junior College, Hackettstown, New Jersey early in September.
