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

PROGRAM PLANNING 1996: CJCLS is teaming with ECLSS (the Extended Campus Library Services Section) of offer an excellent program entitled "Leadership on the Cybercampus Commons: Where are We in the Vision?" We plan for the program to

The CJCLS Awards Committee is seeking nominees for the EBSCO Leadership and Program awards for 1995. An individual nominated for the Leadership Award must be a member of the ACRL/CJCLS Section in order to be eligible for nomination.

Each awardee will receive a check for \$500 and a citation donated by EBSCO Subscription Services. The presentations will be made during the CJCLS Business Meeting at the ALA Annual Conference in New York.

The deadline for receipt of applications is December 1, 1995. The Committee will review applications at the ALA Midwinter Meeting in San Antonio.


Reference Resources Review Committee

The Fondren Foundation has just funded at San Jacinto College a pilot project for instructing faculty to use Internet in their classes for \$26,470. The total program costing \$118,000 will develop faculty leadership teams on the campuses who are experienced in Internet instruction.

Forty faculty and librarians will be trained in the use of Internet and terminals will be purchased for both the libraries and the faculty. The program will provide a firm foundation for the increasing use by faculty and students of the information resources that will be so critical to us in the future.
