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Technology Highlighted in Joint CJCLS/ECLSS Program for ALA New York Conference

No matter how wired campuses become, colleges and universities are still people dependent and need visionary leaders. "Leadership on the Cybercampus Commons: Where Are We in the Vision?" is our conference program - one jointly planned with the Community and Extended Campus Library Services Section. The program is scheduled for Saturday, July 6, from 9:30 - 11:00 a.m.

A panel of senior academic leaders will discuss their strategies to enlarge the reach of the campus and enhance learning by use of telecommunications and computer technologies. In doing so, they are creating a "cypercampus commons" where teaching and learning are not necessarily constrained by time, location, or access to information resources. They will define and discuss their own institution's or system's perspective and address the question uppermost in the minds of library professionals, "Where do we fit into their visions?"

Nancy Allen, Dean and Director, Penrose Library, University of Denver, will moderate the program. Joining her as panelists are James V. Koch, President, Old Dominion University, Norfolk, Va; James Hall, President, SUNY Empire State College, Saratoga Springs, NY; Gil Gonzales, Dean of Information Technology Services, Mesa Community College, Phoenix, AZ; and Richard Skinner, President, Clayton State College, Morrow, GA.

This program is one of nine selected by ACRL to support ACRL President Particia Senn Breivik's 1996 President's Conference theme, "Every Librarian a Leader." The program has received generous sponsorship from OCLC, Inc.

Please plan to attend this program and invite others. The CJCLS and ECLSS Program Planning Committees would like to reach our goal of having 400 "library leaders" as the audience.



1996 CJCLS EBSCO Leadership Awards

The CJCLS EBSCO Leadership Awards
Committee met at ALA Midwinter and selected
the 1996 awardees. The Leadership Award
goes to Margaret A. Holleman, Director of
Library Services, Pima Community College.
Peggy, as we know her, has had an outstanding
career of leadership. As her nominator said,
"Peggy has been professionally active through
publications, presentations, and other activities
throughout her career."

She served as editor of Community & Junior College Libraries between 1981 and 1991. She has published widely on a variety of topics. She served as Chair of CJCLS in 1993-94. She has also been very active in the Community College Association for Instruction and Technology and was editor of the CCAIT Newsletter, 1987-1992.

The 1996 Library Program Award will be given to Southwestern College Library, Chula Vista, CA., for the development of a comprehensive multimedia student library orientation. The developers used an Apple Macintosh program that utilizes interactive maps, floor plans, animation, over 100 photographs, and 10 quick-time movies. Patrons can orient themselves whenever the college library is open.

William J. Alexander, Dean of Library Services, served as designer/programmer, Ronald W. Vess, Bibliographic Instruction Librarian, served as the content specialist, and Timothy E. Alexander, served as the photographer -videographer. The project was featured in the Chronicle of Higher Education, October 13, 1995, "College Invites Students to Take Virtual Tour of Library".

The Awards will be presented at the CJCLS Business meeting at the ALA Annual Conference in New York City, on Saturday, July 6, 1996.

ACRL Standards Study Taskforce Gretchen Neill reported that this committee has completed its mission and has two recommendations The first is communication from the ACRL Office to all disciplinary/professional and regional accreditation agency executive directors along with a current copy of the ACRL Standards. This communication would ask that the accreditation agency be aware of our academic standards and make reference to them, if appropriate, in their work. The second recommendation is that ACRL consider sponsoring a conference/workshop in Chicago, for accreditation officers from the six regional associations, selected disciplinary/professional agency officers, and selected library administrators interested in this area. The workshop's purpose would be to share perspectives and exchange ideas on the changing roles of libraries in a changing accreditation environment.

Survey

Mary Jo Lynch (E-mail: Mary Jo.Lynch@ala.org) will be sending out a survey on electronic services in academic libraries this spring. The survey will try to gather information on how libraries can measure performance and effectiveness and what IPED's should look like in regard to new forms of access and new types of resources available in libraries.

Publications

Wanda Johnston reported that she is on the Editorial Board of Monographs in Librarianship. This board is looking for books, dissertations, papers, etc., for publication and she encourages community college participation.

Instruction Committee

The committee is focusing its efforts in three areas:

1. A research study aimed at determining how successful library programs, and library instruction in particular, contribute to student success and retention. The study will consider academic programs, vocational programs, at-risk students, developmental education students, as well as other factors that have traditionally been indicators of

success on community college campuses. A subcommittee was established to focus the study and propose a workable project to the committee at the annual conference in July. The chair will also seek assistance, or the appointment of a liaison, from committees within ALA that include the fostering of research within their committee charge.

- 2. Draft a proposal and outline for a publication focused on community college library instruction.
- 3. Sponsor a discussion forum at the ACRL Conference in Nashville.

- 3. Use listservs or a home page to exchange information about sources for two-year colleges. and
- 4. Organize an informal discussion session at the Annual Conference in New York to discuss

review sources or potential review sources for twoyear colleges.
