NEW ORLEANS CONFERENCE 1993 PROGRAM - ALMA DAWSON, Chair

"Afro-American Information Resources, 1960s through 1990s: Quality Issues" panel discussion

Representative from ACRL Social Issues Task Force gave a brief overview of the National Conference Controversy. Arizona site was withdrawn; St. Louis local chapter ACRL did not invite conference, Salt Lake City local ACRL chapter invited conference and ACRL accepted. Women Studies Section withdrew program and Racial Ethnic Diversity also withdrew program because these groups did not agree with Utah's policy on social issues. Salt Lake City has strong census on sex education and abortion. ACRL Social Issues Task Force will have an open hearing in San Francisco on draft guidelines on How ACRL responses to social issues.

Brenda Mitchell-Powell editor of <u>Multicultural Review</u> is looking for reviewers (203) 221-1224 Reviews 200 words. A commitment to four reviews a year will get free subscription. Brenda has volunteered her company, Orange Ball Corporation, to assist in the printing of the rainbow brochure for AFAS.

Discussion Topic: How has the new emphasis on multiculturalism and diversity affected support for African American Studies collections? Has it given new support and visibility or has it increased the competition for limited resources allocated to an area of endeavor? What can or should the ACRL Afro-American Studies Librarians' Section do to support our members?

Response: Baruch College - Institution is not hiring enough ethnic diversity. \$63,000 is budgeted for all multiethnic groups books budget cut by \$300,000.

Kent state University - has new director uses Pan African (global approach) African Studies. Identification of level of support. A higher amount can not be spent without special authorization.

University of Florida - Cultural Diversity, second year, includes Latin american, African Studies, African American Studies and Women Studies. Board of Regents lack of support.

Indiana University - Black Cultural Center Library, opens fall 1992. Dean of Afro-American affairs appointed. Funding for library still an issue. Current position half

reference and half at new center. African American materials dispersed throughout regular collections.

Small state liberal arts college (Mary Washington College, Virginia) - No department allocation, The library make the decision. \$20,000 spent on Afro-American materials. Has enrollment of \$3,000.

State of Washington - coordinating Latin, Asian, Afro-American, and American-Ethnic studies \$5,000. American Indians included under Anthropology.
