All Aboard. Sony Wonder. 40 min. \$9.98. CD, \$13.98.

John Denver rides the rails in this collection of train songs which covers a range of musical styles. The artist takes the listener back to the days when the echo of a train whistle evoked a sense of adventure and westward expansion.

Are You There, God? It's Me, Margaret. Listening Library. 3hr9. 2 cassettes, \$16.98.

In this modern classic, Judy Blume portrays the physical, spiritual, and emotional concerns common to all girls on the threshold of adolescence. Laura Hamilton's youthful, animated narration brings Margaret's coming-of-age story to life.

Ballad of Lucy Whipple. Recorded Books. 4hr45. 4 cassettes, \$34.

Karen Cushman's novel of life in the gold fields of California in 1840 is brought vividly to life by Christina Moore's narration. From 12 year old Lucy to the crusty miners and other inhabitants of the town of Lucky Diggins, Moore's characterizations are delightful and authentic.

Battle for the Castle. Listening Library. 4hr33. 3 cassettes, \$23.98.

The Words Take Wings Repertory Company takes the reader back once again to the castle from Elizabeth Winthrop's Castle in the Attic. The two young men who performed the main characters in the original work return, complementing the coming-of-age story line perfectly.

Boggart and the Monster. Listening Library. 4hr43. 3 cassettes, \$23.98.

In this second fantastic adventure of the Boggart, the mischievous house spirit returns to help his cousin Nessie regain his shape-shifting ability. Susan Cooper's humorous, exciting, and surprisingly tender tale is masterfully presented by Rintoul.

Charlie Daniels: By the Light of the Moon--Campfire Songs and Cowboy Tunes. Sony Wonder. 40min. \$9.98. CD, \$13.98.

Step back in time with the Charlie Daniels band as they fiddle up your favorite songs of the Old West. Sing and stamp along to "Git along, little Dogies," "I'm an Old Cowhand," "Sixteen Tons," and seven other lively tunes.

Chuck and Danielle. Listening Library. 1hr56. 2 cassettes, \$16.98.

Andrew Sachs' impeccable reading brings to life the high-strung dogginess of Chuck the whippet and her mistress Danielle. Dry British humour abounds.

Coconut Moon. Performed by the Green Chili Jam Band. Squeaky Wheel Productions. 44min. \$14.98.

High energy and fine musicality are evident in this delightful recording from the lilting title song to the wryly humorous "Lard (a tragedy)" to the choral synchronizing of "Tic Toc." Coconut Moon will charm children of all ages.

Crash. Recorded Books. 4hr. 3 cassettes, \$26.

School football star and accomplished bully Crash Coogan meets an unlikely match in his pacifist classmate, Penn Webb. Jeff Woodman's superb narration captures life from a bully's point of view.

Giving Thanks. Weston Woods. Book/cassette, \$24.95.

Chief Swamp authentically delivers this message of peace and appreciation of Mother Earth based on the Iroquois Thanksgiving Address read in both English and the Mohawk language.

The Great Gilly Hopkins. Recorded Books. 4hr45. 4 cassettes, \$34.

Gilly Hopkins is perfecting the art of driving people crazy until she arrives at the foster home of Maime Trotter where she meets her match. Katherine Paterson's Newbery Honor Book is given a spirited and heartfelt reading by Bresnahan, whose characterization of each voice is right on target.

Harlem. Spoken Arts. 8min. Book/cassette, \$27.90.

Told with love and affection, Ruby Dee and Ossie Davis capture the excitement and energy of life in Harlem. Jazz music provides the backdrop for this special kit which includes a copy of the 1998 Caldecott Honor Book.

Harriet and the Promised Land. Spoken Arts. 7min. Book/cassette, \$16.95.

Ruby Dee's rich, textured voice brings the inspiring story of Harriet Tubman alive. The kit includes the book illustrated in the rich primitive art of Jacob Lawrence.

Lily's plans for a happy summer at the beach are shattered when her father is sent overseas just after D-Day 1944. Christina Moore sensitively portrays the conflicting emotions of both Lily and her friend Albert in this 1998 Newbery Honor Book.

Lubotsky convincingly portrays thirteen-year-old Phoebe as she remembers good times and bad in this poignant and sometimes irreverent memoir of her younger brother, Mick.

Kevin Roth skillfully blends traditional bedtime material with original words and music on this soothing lullaby recording. A reworking of the traditional prayer *Now I lay me down to sleep,* familiar favorites *Little fishies* and *Hush little baby,* and originals like the reassuring *I'll be there* comfort and relax listeners of all ages.

Rathmann's Caldecott medal book about a safety officer and his canine companion comes to life courtesy of Lithgow's droll presentation.
