At the reading of their grandmother's will, Dan and Amy Cahill are given the choice of receiving a million dollars or uncovering the 39 clues that will lead to the source of their family's power. David Pittu brings this interactive tale to life with a spirited narration.

*Celia Cruz: Queen of Salsa*. Live Oak. 16 min. CD. 1-800-788-1121. Gr. K-5. Cuban born salsa singer Celia Cruz always had a magical vibrancy even as a child. Using music and sound effects and featuring narration and singing by Michelle Manzo, this charming readalong offers a glimpse into Celia's life.

Clementine's Letter. Recorded Books. 2.5 hr. 2 CDs. Gr. 2-5. Clementine's beloved teacher Mr. D'Matz might be leaving, so she hatches a plan to get him

back even if it means ruining his once-in-a-lifetime chance. Narrator Jessica Almasy captures all the exuberance of the well-meaning heroine.

Curse of the Blue Tattoo: Being an Account of the Misadventures of Jacky Faber, Midshipman and Fine Lady. Listen & Live Audio. 14 hours. 11 CDs. 1-800-653-9400. Middle School/YA.

Versatile narrator Katherine Kellgren takes feisty, seafaring Mary "Jacky" Faber on an ill-fated voyage to become a lady as Jacky stretches her seas legs at an elite Boston finishing school in this humorous and melodramatic sequel to Bloody Jack, a 2008 Odyssey Award Honor title. (2009 Odyssey Honor Audiobook)

*The dead and the gone*. Listening Library. 8 hr. 51 min. 7 CDs. Gr. 6 – 12. Narrator Robertson Dean lends a chilling air of suspense telling the story of Alex Morales and his siblings' struggle for survival after an asteroid hits New York City in this novel by Susan Beth Pfeffer.

Mirron Willis narrates Christopher Paul Curtis' award-winning tale of Elijah, who's life changes when he embarks on a dangerous journey to America in pursuit of a thief and discovers the horrors of slavery. **Good Masters! Sweet Ladies! Voices from a Medieval Village**. Recorded Books. 1.5 hr. 2 CDs. Gr. 4 – 9.

Listeners get a glimpse of life in medieval times as told by a wide variety of characters from nobility to beggar – enhanced by narrator Christina Moore and a full cast.

Ukuleles, native Hawaiian language, and the sliding sounds of slack key guitars bring the Aloha State right into the room with this collection of fun songs (some in English, some in Hawaiian) by different performers.

Join a backhoe loader for a day of work in this fanciful romp featuring big machinery. Steve Buscemi captures all the enthusiasm of this personified backhoe. With music by David Mansfield adding the perfect touch, this audio lets young readers follow every dirty minute of the day's work. (2009 Odyssey Honor Audiobook)

*Martina the Beautiful Cockroach: A Cuban Folktale* . Peachtree Publishers. 10 min. CD. 1-800-241-0113. Elementary.

Storyteller Carmen Agra Deedy brings spirited wit and cultural touches to her retelling of the traditional Cuban tale of Martina's quest to find a husband. Bonus tracks include a Spanish version and storytelling performance. (2009 Odyssey Honor Audiobook)

Narrator Terry Donnelly fully captures both the joys and frustrations of Helen Keller's tutor, Anne Sullivan, in their first days together in this fictionalized diary account of Anne's struggle to communicate with blind and deaf Helen.

Antonia Lucia Labella has a secret ambition to become a saint, but also a secret desire to catch the eye of a "hottie." This warm, engaging story of a 15-year-old Catholic girl is expertly narrated by Emily Bauer.

**Red Moon at Sharpsburg**. Recorded Books. 7 hr. 6 CDs. Gr. 5 – 8.

Coming of age during the American Civil War, 13- year-old India Moody faces both danger and heartbreak as she concentrates on surviving. Julia Gibson narrates this sweeping epic of determination and self-scarifice.

Jessica Almasy voices the story of Jamie who receives a roll of film to process from her brother who is serving in Viet Nam. This begins her journey of understanding not only herself, but the larger world around her.

Wolf's point of view, narrator Paul Giamatti presents a compelling case for the wolf's innocence. A great use of music, pacing, and narration add just the right touch of humor in this read-along by Jon Scieszka.
