Evil librarians are trying to take over the world. Ramón de Ocampo deftly voices the recluctant, snarky hero, Alcatraz Smedry.

The Apothecary, 8 hrs. CD. Penguin, 1-800-847-5515. Grades 6 - 9 (11 - 15).

Reader Cristin Milioti switches seamlessly between American, British and Russian accents in this fantasy set during the Cold War.

Beethoven's Wig: Sing Along Piano Classics, 46min. 5 sec. Music CD. Beethoven's Wig, 1-413-835-0484. Ages 4 and up.

Richard Perlmutter introduces piano classics and notable composers, resulting in a great time for all in this CD that invites listeners to sing along.

Clementine and the Family Meeting, 2 hrs. CD or Cassette. Recorded Books. Grades 2 - 4 (7 - 10).

Jessica Almasy narrates Clementine with emotion perfectly suited to a third grader realizing that her family dynamics are about to change.

Countdown, 7 hrs. 20 min., CD. Listening Library, 1-800-733-3000. Grades 5 - 8 (10 - 14). Emma Galvin's narration and historical audio clips capture the story of an 11-year-old girl growing up during the Cuban Missile Crisis.

Dead End in Norvelt, 7 hrs. CD. Macmillan, 1-888-330-8477. Grades 5 - 8 (10 - 14). Jack Gantos narrates this mostly true story of his boyhood summer escaping Hell's Angels and writing obituaries, all while he was grounded at home.

Dear America: Like the Willow Tree, 4 hrs. 17 min. CD. Scholastic, 1-800-290-7531. Grades 4 - 6 (9 - 12).

Sara Barnett relates the story of Lydia Amelia Pierce during the Spanish Influenza epidemic of 1918. Historical photos, Shaker music and a note from the author help fill out the story.

Don't Let the Pigeon Stay Up Late!, 5 min., CD/Book. Weston Woods, 1-800-243-5020. PreK - 2 (3 - 7).

Author and illustrator Mo Willems energetically voices the wheedling pigeon who does not want to go to bed in this adaptation of his popular book.

Ella Jenkins: A Life of Song, 36 min., Music CD. Smithsonian Folkways, 1-800-410-9815. Ages 4 and up.

Ella Jenkins, the matriarch of children's music, has teamed up with children and others to deliver a collection of stories and songs inspired by her early life.

Fletcher and the Springtime Blossoms, 7 min. CD/Book. Weston Woods. Grades PreK - 2 (4 - 7).

Against a delightful soundtrack, Katherine Kellgren's flawless reading portrays Fletcher, who warns his animal friends to return to their winter quarters when he mistakes blossoms for snow.

Ghetto Cowboy, 4hrs. CD. Brilliance Audio, 1-800-648-2312. (2012 Odyssey Honor Audiobook)

Narrator JD Jackson delivers a rich baritone performance as twelve-year-old Cole, a boy who grows from near-delinquent to responsible teen and passionate horseman as he helps his father and the cowboys save their endangered stables in inner-city Philadelphia.

The Incorrigible Children of Ashton Place, Book 2: The Hidden Gallery, 5 hrs. 57 min., CD. Listening Library. Grades 4 - 7 (9 - 13).

With precise comic timing, Katherine Kellgren does not shy away from barking and howling while managing the rich vocabulary and exciting action of this gothic mystery.

Ivy and Bean: What's the Big Idea?, 1 hr.15 min., CD or Cassette. Recorded Books. Grades 2 - 4 (7 - 10).

With humor and heart, Cassandra Morris portrays Ivy and Bean as they search for the perfect science project. A note about global warming extends the lesson.

Jefferson's Sons, 10 hrs. 24 min., CD. Listening Library. Grades 6 - 9 (11 -15). A young slave asks why he can't call his own father "papa." Adenrele Ojo voices the questions of Thomas Jefferson's sons and carries the assurance of their mother that her enslaved children will one day be free.

Jessica, 7 min. 27 sec., CD/Book. Live Oak Media, 1-800-788-1121. PreK - K (3 - 6). Ruthie's parents say her friend Jessica isn't real, but she is to Ruthie. Katherine Kellgren's performance captures Ruthie's sincerity and vulnerability in this story of friendship.

Marilyn Singer and Joe Morton bring exuberance, humor and point of view to familiar fairy tales in 14 reverso poems.

Moon Over Manifest, 9 hrs. 25 min., CD. Listening Library. Grades 5 - 8 (10 - 14). Jenna Lamia along with Cassandra Campbell and Kirby Heyborne tell the story of Abilene Tucker's adventures in Manifest during the summer of 1936.

Okay for Now, 9 hrs. 18 min., CD. Listening Library. Grades 6 - 9 (11 -15). Lincoln Hoppe voices Douglas Swieteck with all the attitude and hurt that this young teen experiences in "stupid" Marysville, N.Y. in 1968. (2012 Odyssey Honor Audiobook)

Operation Yes, 6 hrs. 28 min, CD. Brilliance Audio. Grades 4 - 7 (9 - 13), Jessica Almasy's performance reflects the ups and downs of 6th graders living on a military base while friends and relatives serve in Afghanistan.

With charm and humor, Jenna Lamia captures the perspectives of three sisters as boys begin to play a new role in their lives.

Authentic instrumentation and lyrics, in eleven African languages, provide a unique reading and listening experience of traditional lullabies and nursery rhymes common to Black Africa.

Stone Soup, 10 min. 12 sec. CD/Book. Weston Woods. Grades PreK - 3 (5 - 8). This traditional folktale, narrated by B.D. Wong, is given a new twist in this thoughtfully crafted production.

Thunder over Kandahar, 6 hrs. 36 min, CD. Listening Library. Grades 7 - 10 (12 - 16). This contemporary novel of friendship in the midst of the war in Afghanistan is enriched by Mozhan Marno's lyrical reading.

The Unforgotten Coat, 1 hr. 40 min., CD. Brilliance Audio. Grades 4 - 7 (10 - 13), Sarah Coomes' performance conveys Julie's feelings as she becomes the "good guide" for two mysterious new students from Mongolia.

Young Fredle. 6 hrs. 30 min. Listening Library. (2012 Odyssey Honor Audiobook) Wendy Carter captures all the curiosity, fear and delight of young Fredle, as listeners follow the mouse's adventures both inside and outside the house. Voigt's gentle and heartwarming story

features cats, dogs, raccoons and owls, all brought to fine characterization through Carter's spectacular performance.
