#### Successes

- 1. 2014 ILA Legislative Committee members met personally with the governor, Speaker of the House, Senate Pro Tem, and chairs of important legislative committees on ILA Lobby Day in Feb.
- Asked to have a librarian appointed to the Governor's Task Force for Education' Literacy Committee. Request was granted. Natalie Nation from Meridian Public Library was chosen to serve on the committee representing librarians.
- Asked for support for the Idaho Commission for Libraries' budget request to double funding for the ReadtoMe
- mini grants that provide funds to put books in the hands of children in rural libraries, from low income schools libraries, and day cares around the state. The requested budget was fully funded.
- Explained the complications in funding, regulating, and enforcing stricter public library internet filtering laws in hopes of dissuading legislators from going forward with any more bills this year. No such bills came forward during the session.
- 2. The Membership Committee restructured the membership dues.
- 3. Idaho Library Association and the Idaho Commission for Libraries collaborated to create a new team of librarians from across the state. The group is called LiLAC (Library Leadership Advisory Committee) and met in person and online to identify library leadership needs in Idaho and create resources for library leaders across all areas of library service.
- 4. The ILA Annual Convention in Lewiston was very successful with many insightful sessions and plenty of quality collaboration time. Special features included a private open house visit to the new Lewiston Public Library and a live theater performance on the history of Lewiston, the original capital city of Idaho.
- 5. ILA Book Awards went to two books on the topic of Idaho internment camps:
- Surviving Minidoka by Russell Tremayne and Todd Shallat
- Rugged as the Terrain by Priscilla Wegars
