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Introduction

The EBSS Curriculum Materials Committee has a long-standing commitment to tracking the existence of curriculum materials centers and collections. These records provide answers about peer institutions, demonstrate trends, and educate on the importance of curriculum materials in higher education.

Definitions

For the purposes of this directory:

- Curriculum materials are defined as, "...educational resources that provide curriculum and instructional experiences for preschool through 12th grade (P-12) students. These materials are used by educators to develop curricula and lesson plans and may also be used in actual instructional situations with P-12 students. These materials also provide information for those conducting research." Specific resources include textbooks, curriculum guides/courses of study, children's and young adult literature, professional materials, reference materials, P-12 and professional periodicals, media materials, instructional materials, tests, and web resources.
- Curriculum materials centers are specialized collections of curriculum materials with a defined physical location that support P-12 preservice teacher education within colleges and universities. These defined spaces may be a set area in the main library, a fullservice branch library, or within a school of education. Curriculum materials centers (CMCs) may also be referred to as curriculum labs, instructional materials labs, curriculum resource centers, instructional materials centers, teaching materials centers, education resource commons, curriculum laboratories, learning resource centers, etc.^{2,3}
- Curriculum materials collections are defined as a set of curriculum materials that support the instructional and research needs of teacher education programs in higher education regardless of a specific physical location.

Curriculum materials centers and collections (CMCs) are both represented in this directory. The resources of CMCs align with preservice teachers' academic programs and consist of P-12 instructional materials, various learning technologies or educational equipment, curriculum development materials, and pedagogical resources.

History of CMC Directories

In 1979, the ACRL Education and Behavioral Sciences Section initiated the first directory survey for Curriculum Materials Centers (CMCs). The results, compiled by Lehman and Kiewitt, were published in 1981 and included responses from 189 CMCs.⁴ Subsequently, Lehman and Kiewitt compiled the second edition, which incorporated information from 161 CMCs. The focus of these initial editions was on holdings information, materials budgets, classification systems, staffing, loan policies, hours of operation, and the addition of cooperative affiliations in 1985.

Later editions introduced more comprehensive survey questions that encompassed institutional demographics, funding sources, detailed collection and holdings statistics, as well as various inquiries about facilities and staffing. In the 7th edition of the directory, released in 2015, the compilers took deliberate steps to highlight that the directory encompassed both centers and collections.⁵ This important clarification has continued in the 8th edition.

The number of institutions in the directory reached its peak with 278 in the 4th edition in 1996 and has subsequently declined to this 8th edition with 112 responses (see Table 1). Recognizing the potential negative impact of the directory's growing comprehensiveness and length on survey participation and completion, the 8th edition directory committee made the decision to streamline the survey and removed previous survey questions regarding topics such as weeding practices, databases and subscriptions, and donation policies.

Data Collection Method

The survey instrument used to collect the directory information for this 8th edition was modified from the survey used for the 7th edition. The Curriculum Materials Committee (Committee) reviewed the entire instrument and decided to focus on selected information for the 8th version of the directory. These sections included: contact information, institution

demographics, facilities and staffing, funding, and types of materials collected. Additional directory information was included such as social media platform links, names of accrediting and certification bodies, and the Carnegie level of each institution. These new survey points will provide CMCs with new avenues to share and view content as well as seek out comparison institutions during accreditation periods. The data collection form concluded with an open-ended question inviting participants to provide information about what they would like to learn about other CMCs to inform future projects for the Committee. The data collection instrument was built in Qualtrics.

Two primary approaches were used to solicit information from CMCs for the current directory during the spring, summer, and fall of 2022. First, the Committee utilized communication channels within the Education and Behavioral Sciences Section (EBSS). The Committee posted four participation invitation announcements to the EBSS ALA Connect space (April 21, 2022; May 10, 2022; May 24, 2022; September 1, 2022). Announcements were also shared in the spring 2022 EBSS Newsletter and on the EBSS Facebook page on May 27, 2022. Second, the Committee developed a distribution list based on responses to prior surveys. With the help of library student workers at the University of Central Florida Curriculum Materials Center, a spreadsheet was created with a list of CMCs that participated in the 4th, 6th, and 7th editions of the directory as well as with potential CMCs additions from internet searches. From this list, 173 individuals were sent invitations to complete the survey via Qualtrics during summer 2022. In November 2022, committee members personally emailed all CMCs on the spreadsheet that had not yet responded. The survey officially closed to additional responses on December 9, 2022.

The Committee reviewed the submitted data for typos and errors while standardizing certain free response fields. For several institutions multiple employees completed the survey, sometimes with answers in contradiction with each other. In these cases, the Committee reached out to participants directly to create a final agreed upon representation of the CMC.

The 8th edition of the directory includes 112 curriculum materials centers and collections. This is down from 161 CMCs that participated in the 7th edition of the directory. Twelve institutions directly contacted the Committee either reporting that their CMC was no longer in operation or that they did not want to be included in the 8th edition of the directory.

Layout of the Current Directory

The current directory is organized in alphabetical order by name of the institution. To have an entry in the directory, participants were only required to fill out two fields on the form: name of institution and name of library, school, or department the center/collection is associated with. The Committee also deleted sections that were left blank by the CMC respondent, so the directory only contains sections for which a CMC submitted responses.

Visualizations of aggregated findings can be found in the Figures section at the end of the directory. This includes plotting the CMCs by state and province, budgetary analysis, staffing levels, and more. Additionally, the appendix concludes with the survey instrument.

Limitations of the Directory

This directory has several limitations. It is not a complete picture of the number of CMCs in the United States and Canada. Due to the convenience sampling, extrapolations cannot be made as to the current number of CMCs and if that number is declining. Based on online

presences and outreach efforts, the committee acknowledges there are existing CMCs which are not represented in this directory.

Some institutions expressed that their answers were best estimates due to limited institutional data to pull from. The committee cannot verify the accuracy of the information provided by survey institution and recognize that the provided answers are also subject to change.

The committee chose to alter the survey instrument for the 8th edition to decrease the estimated time for completion and encourage greater participation. This may limit the ability to directly compare 8th edition responses to past directories.




Figure 2. Curriculum Materials Centers/Collections by State/Province




Figure 4. Undergraduate and Graduate Education Student Enrollment




Figure 5. Undergraduate and Graduate Education Student Enrollment




Figure 7. Location of Curriculum Materials Center/Collection at Institution




Figure 8. Hours the Curriculum Materials Center/Collection is Typically Accessible





Figure 9. Number of Employees Supporting the Curriculum Materials Center/Collection – Professional Librarians, Staff, Student Employees

Figure 10. Approximate Annuals Collections Budget for the Curriculum Materials Centers/Collections




Figure 11. Approximate Annuals Collections Budget for the Curriculum Materials Centers/Collections


