

RESOLUTION ON THE 200TH ANNIVERSARY
OF THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION

WHEREAS, The United States will celebrate the 200th anniversary of its Constitution September, 1987; and

WHEREAS, Libraries of all types are important sources of information about the Constitution; and

WHEREAS, Libraries are convenient and logical sites for information about civic observances of the anniversary and for the coordination of community activities; NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, That the American Library Association urge the United States Bicentennial Commission and the National Commission on Libraries and Information Science to make use of libraries across America as a major contact point for transmission of information on recommended anniversary projects and planning procedures to every community; and, BE IT FURTHER

RESOLVED, That this resolution be sent to all State Library Associations, State School Library Media Associations, all State Library Agencies, Bicentennial Constitution Commissions in all the States, and other appropriate agencies.
