SENATOR WARREN G. MAGNUSON

WHEREAS, Senator Warren G. Magnuson, better known as "Maggie," served the State of Washington faithfully as legislator, congressman, and member of the Senate of the United States from 1933 through 1980; and

WHEREAS, Senator Magnuson supported legislation of benefit to libraries and education at both the state and national levels; and

WHEREAS, Senator Magnuson was instrumental in the enactment and funding for the following, to list but a few highlights:

- (1) Enactment of the Library Services Act on June 19, 1956
- (2) Enactment of the Higher Education Act on November 8, 1965
- (3) Enactment of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act on April 11, 1965
- (4) Enactment of the expanded Library Services and Construction Act on August 31, 1960
- (5) Funding for travel costs and training for Library 21 in 1961
- (6) Funding for the new Library of Congress James Madison Memorial Building, completed in 1980; and

WHEREAS, Senator Magnuson was always available to offer advice and counsel when legislative problems arose; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED That the American Library Association adopt this Resolution expressing the Association's deepest gratitude for Senator Magnuson's support during all his years in public office.
