The Foundation's Business & Communities Grants Program addresses economic isolation in America by investing in business-community partnerships that expand opportunities for people to retain and advance in their jobs, earn living wages, and accumulate savings and assets. Funded projects must demonstrate effective and innovative corporate citizenship practices and/or promote learning and adoption of good practices. Proposals may only be submitted at the Foundation's invitation. However, nonprofit organizations that meet the Foundation's eligibility requirements are welcome to share initial information through the online inquiry system at any time.
