All libraries are urged by the Council of the American Library Association to observe 1968 as International Year for Human Rights. It is suggested that they establish special programs and plan displays on this theme throughout the year.

This is in line with a resolution passed by the ALA Council at its 1967 Annual Conference:

**RESOLVED:** That the Council of the American Library Association calls on all libraries to observe 1968 as International Year for Human Rights by making materials available; by establishing and carrying on programs, including displays appropriate to their users; and calls on groups within the Association to consider the observance of International Year for Human Rights for their programs in 1968.

The year-long observance will call attention to the 20th Anniversary of the adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights by the United Nations on December 10, 1948. The ALA, in cooperation with the United States National Committee for UNESCO and other professional, civic and service organizations, is cooperating in the observance of the International Year for Human Rights.
