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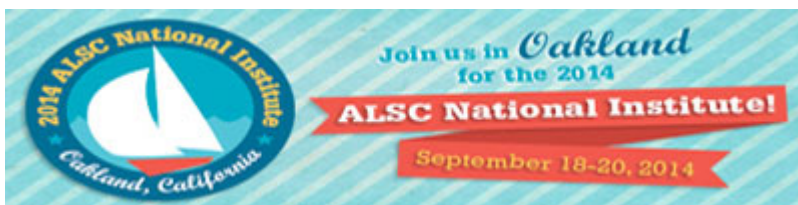

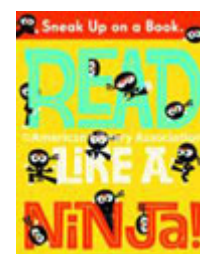

Public Library changes lives of children in Kenya

“When I see that I have changed the life of a child, I am really happy. I can say that there is an impact in what I am doing.”– Mary Kinyanjui, librarian, Kibera Public Library, Kenya. From the moment it opened its doors to the community in June 2012, Kibera Public Library made helping children a priority. The library’s tablet computer education project is supported by a grant from the EIFL (Electronic Information for Libraries) Public Library Innovation Programme (EIFL-PLIP). The



grant enabled the library to design a computer skills and education programme, working in partnership with the Kenyan educational agency eLimu, which creates digital content for schools in fun formats like animations, video and quizzes. ([VIDEO](#))
